Integrating wastewise themes into the curriculum

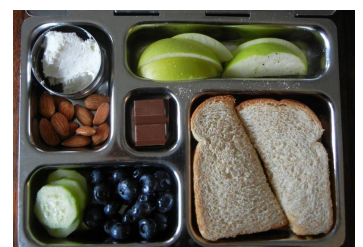


We have Waste free lunch boxes.

We use containers, beeswax wraps, paper wraps and lunch boxes with compartments.

This means no plastic wrap, no plastic wrappers, no yoghurt pots or squeezies.

What does a waste free lunch box look like:



Waste free lunch box tips:

- Have a go at cooking, the more we cook the less packaged stuff we buy, go to www.lunchbox.inc
- Swap out plastic wrap for a container or beeswax wrap.
- Buy large bags of chips and put a handful into a reusable container each day.
- Remove the muesli bar wrapper before putting it in the lunchbox (recycle it at a supermarket).
- Buy large pots of yoghurt and scoop some into a container.
